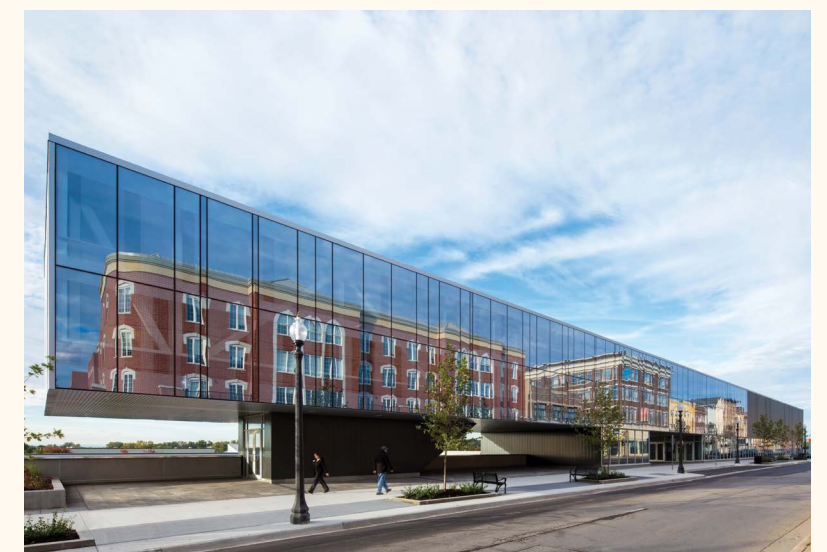

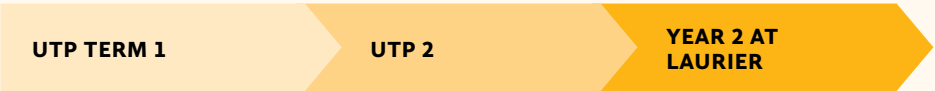

Our programs

Whether you are looking for foundation or are ready for university courses, WLIC has a program for you.

Our **UTP Stage I** program is an eight-course program designed to help you transition to university-level programs in the Faculty of Arts, Faculty of Liberal Arts, Faculty of Science, Lazaridis School of Business and Economics, and the Faculty of Human and Social Sciences. Strong students may be able to jump and complete the program in four months.

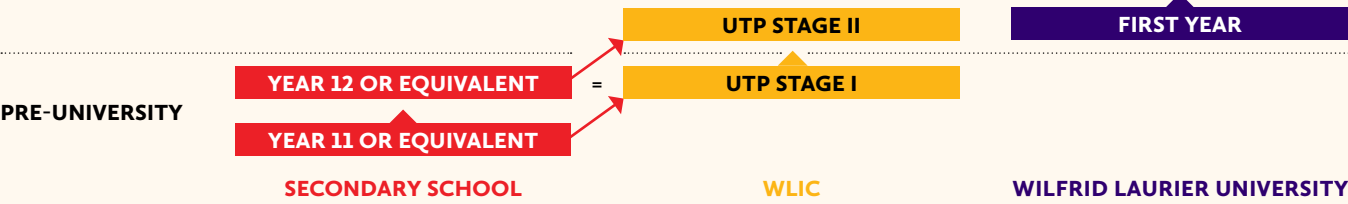


Score 70% or higher on all 4 UTP I courses in term 1 and jump to UTP2.

Our **UTP Stage II** qualification is the equivalent to first year university. After your graduation from WLIC's UTP Stage II program, you are able to transition to year 2 at Wilfrid Laurier University



UNIVERSITY LEVEL



Entry into UTP Stage II is dependent upon successful completion of UTP Stage I or satisfactory completion of Year 12 or equivalent.
Entry into second year of your university degree is dependent upon successful completion of UTP Stage II with the specified Grade Point Average (GPA).

UTP STAGE I

UTP Stage I prepares students for university. After completing two terms and eight courses, students can progress to UTP Stage 2, WLIC's year one university program.

All direct and integrated entry students are required to take (and pass) ILC101– Introduction to our Learning Community in their first term of study unless exempted. Students who are exempt from ILC101 will be required to take (and pass) ILS101 – Integrated Learning Skills.

70% JUMP RULE

Students may be eligible to “Jump” to UTP Stage II if in a single term, they successfully complete four UTP Stage I classes (not including ILS/ILC) with a minimum 70% in each course.

UTP STAGE II

In UTP Stage II, students take 10 academic courses in their degree subject. They will also take academic support courses. Upon successful completion of UTP Stage II, students are able to progress to the second year of their degree at Wilfrid Laurier University.

- **Health Studies (Honours BA)**
Health Studies is an interdisciplinary approach to the study of health and health care. Students learn that health is determined by far more than the availability of health care and that health care itself involves more than simply treating illness.
- **Health Administration (Honours BA)**
The Laurier Health Administration program offers a blend of health studies, leadership, business and contemporary studies courses, designed to give students a broad understanding of the diverse factors affecting the development and delivery of health care, both domestically and internationally.

In your psychology courses, you may study diverse issues such as how children develop empathy, how memories are formed and retained, why some people suffer from addiction, and how our psychological and physical states are connected.

- **Data Science (Honours BSc)**
Data-driven decision making has become the industry standard, creating unprecedented demand for data-oriented professionals to analyze patterns and models for all kinds of data, with applications ranging from scientific discovery to business intelligence and analytics.
- **Computer Science (Honours BSc)**
From applied cryptography to mobile computing, Computer Science will help you develop strong algorithm analysis and design skills in procedural, object-oriented and low-level languages. Our Bachelor of Science (BSc) in Computer Science program provides the hands-on experience that is key to understanding computing fundamentals with an optional introduction to functional, parallel and logical paradigms.
- **Financial Mathematics (BA)**
Laurier's Bachelor of Arts (BA) in Financial Mathematics program is structured to teach you mathematics and its financial applications with a focus on how mathematics is connected with social science and business. The program's modern approach involves simultaneously analyzing financial risks, evaluating prices of complex securities, valuing investments and combined assets, and liability management.
- **Biochemistry and Biotechnology (Honours BSc)**
Learn the core components of chemistry, microbiology, molecular biology and genetics. Apply biochemistry knowledge to develop technologies, materials and products. Gain theoretical and practical skills in molecular biosciences to meet the needs of industry and research.
- **Psychology and Neuroscience (Honours BSc)**
Study of behaviour and experience, including thinking, feeling and action. Examine the structures and function of human and animal nervous systems. Combine these to holistically understand human behaviour.

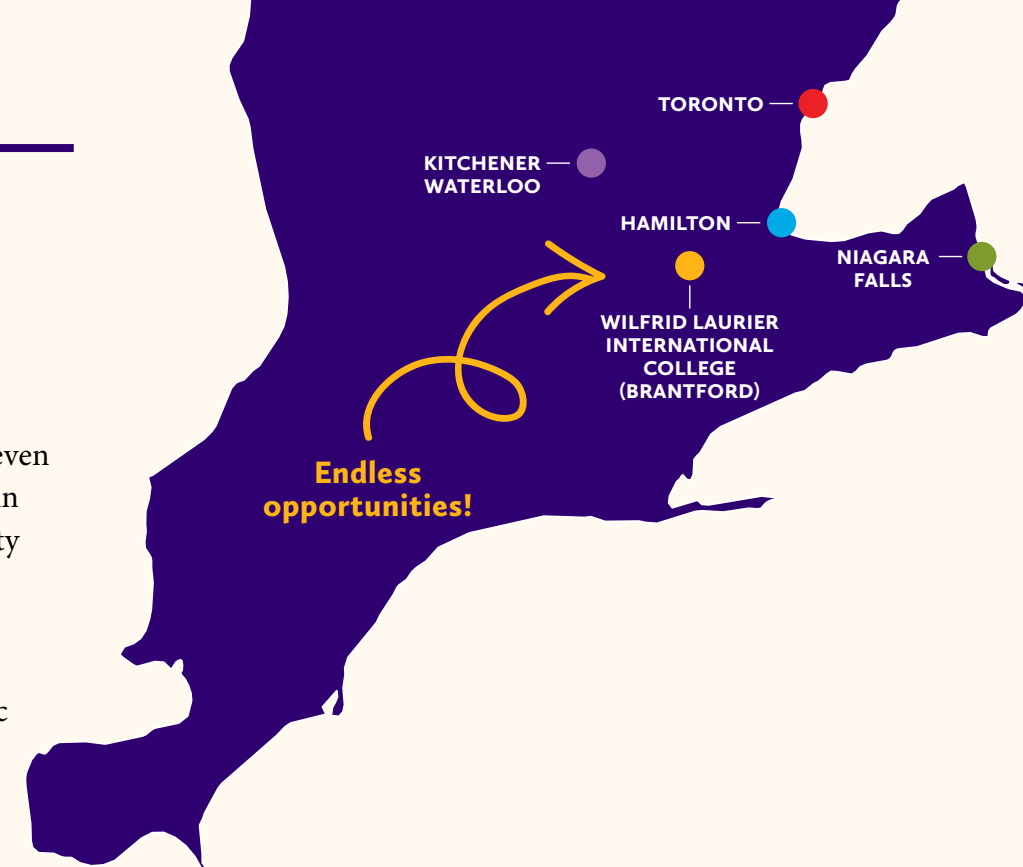
